We've had a wonderfully busy and creative time recently, celebrating a range of special occasions through exciting hands-on activities. It has been fantastic to see so much enthusiasm, imagination, and pride in everything the children have created.

## **THEMED ACTIVITIES**

For Chinese/Lunar New Year, celebrating the Year of the Horse, the room was filled with vibrant colours and energy. The children made beautiful red lanterns decorated with gold and yellow swirls, spirals, and shapes, bringing a real festive feel to the space. They also enjoyed creating unique horse heads, carefully threading wool to make the mane, and bouncing horses, where children used paper springs to make their horses rock back and forth. Lively Chinese dragon puppets with opening mouths for imaginative play were up next, followed by a clever folding craft that revealed a horse on one side and the words "Chinese New Year" on the other.

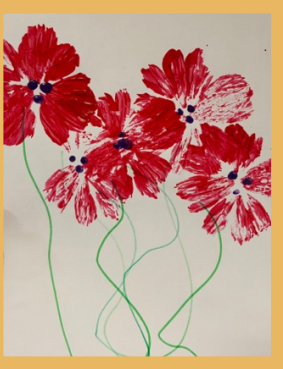
Mother's Day gave us a lovely opportunity to focus on thoughtful and meaningful creations. The children produced stunning painted flower bouquets, using inflated plastic bags to print realistic petals. They looked incredibly effective. They also designed personalised Mother's Day keyrings, thinking carefully about their mums' interests, and created colourful Hama bead designs ranging from "I LOVE YOU" messages to flowers and hearts. Alongside this, they made beautiful bracelets, rings, and necklaces using extra special beads, each piece made with love and care.

St Patrick's Day brought lots of fun, colour, and creativity. The children crafted miniature 3D leprechaun hats by following a paper folding template. They created eye-catching rainbow mosaics using glittery tiles, which were turned into magnets to take home. They also explored different shades of green while making lucky clover paintings with stencils, and had great fun building their own leprechaun faces, finishing them off with bright orange wool beards.

To finish the term, we celebrated Easter with a range of exciting activities. The children made bouncing bunnies using strips of pink paper, folding them with great concentration to create a fun spring effect. They also created beautiful egg decorations by dipping coloured wool into PVA glue and shaping it into unique and eye-catching designs. There was also lots of sensory fun as the children made fluffy foam chicks using a mixture of PVA glue, shaving foam and yellow paint, to create soft, textured bodies. Lots of children enjoyed making edible Easter biscuits, using chocolate icing for a nest, and mini eggs on top. They went down a treat! To round off the celebrations, all children received a small Easter treat containing toys and a couple of chocolate eggs. Some children took part in an Easter egg hunt, where they had to find and collect six different coloured eggs, that were hidden around the school, to earn their treats.

It has been wonderful to see such excitement and engagement from the children. We are always so blown away by what they create.
